Example: EU and Member States' ODA in 2021, as reported to IATI





Example: EU and Member States' ODA from 2022 up to now, as reported to IATI








Sankey diagram

Example: EU and Member States' ODA grants and loans to Africa in 2021, as reported to IATI



Example: EU and Member States' ODA from 2007 up to now, as reported to IATI





Example: European Commission's ODA for Education in 2021



Example: EU and Member States' ODA to Afghanistan and Ukraine, from 2007 up to now, as reported to IATI






Working with PIDG since June 2020 to get their IATI publication fully compliant

Phase 2: Add an additional layer of publishers to the structure, reflecting the implementing companies

Phase 3: Include results reporting and visualization




Data sources

- All data is published using one org identifier as PIDG Trust: XM-DAC-47086
- The performance data is only included at the lowest activity level in the project data (1.1, 1.2, 2.1,2.2 etc.)
 as visualised in the structure. Example of where the performance data is to be found: EAIF Kigali water
 project
- A selection of 6 indicators from their total indicator framework are reported in their IATI data:
 - Total investment commitments in projects at financial close (TICs) (\$m)
 - Private sector investment commitments (\$m)
 - Access to new & improved infrastructure
 - Job creation: short-term
 - Job creation: long-term
 - Fiscal benefits (\$m)
- The indicators used for the company group are the same for all projects of the company group, enabling aggregation of results.




The service shows where, when and how Finland's development cooperation funds have been used. Openaid.fi collects and combines data from different sources under the same service.







Development cooperation is one way of implementing development policy. It involves practical cooperation with developing countries and other partners, such as international organisations and civil society organisations, to achieve development goals.

Humanitarian assistance is an independent part of Finland's development policy. It is granted based on needs assessment. Finland's humanitarian work is grounded on international humanitarian law, human rights treaties and refugee law, as well as on such humanitarian principles established by the United Nations as humanity, impartiality, neutrality and commission independence.
